North Tuddenham Parochial Charities

The charity was originally formed in the 1930's. Income was received from various rents and distributed to the needy of the village.

In the 1970's four charities were formed along with rental income. Again, distributions were made from the dividends from these charities.

In 1995 the four charities were amalgamated into one charity (Henry Young Charity) and units were purchased in the COIF Charities Investment Fund from which share dividends are received every year.

This then is available for distribution to any female 60+ and male 65+ whom the trustees are made aware of.

Another stipulation is that the recipient must have been a North Tuddenham resident for at least 12 months.

RECIPE FOR NOVEMBER

Spicy tomato soup & lemon fried croutons

This is a lovely warming spicy soup to enjoy on Guy Fawkes Night whilst standing around the bonfire. Serve it with tiny cubes of hot lemon-flavoured fried bread. Serves 6-8

Ingredients

50 g butter; 50 g of tomato puree; 50 g of onion finely chopped; soft brown sugar to taste; one sprig of fresh Rosemary or teaspoon of dried Rosemary or one bouquet garni; 500 ml tomato juice; one blade of mace; one clove; 40g flour; half a teaspoon of paprika; 400 ml chicken or turkey stock; half a wine glass of port and 150 ml double cream.

Method

Melt the butter in a heavy based pan. Add onion. Put lid on pan and sweat onion until transparent. Add rosemary or bouquet garni and flour and stir well. Add stock gradually, working soup with a whisk until smooth. Stir in tomato puree, sugar, tomato juice and spices. Cook gently for 20 minutes and strain just before serving. Add the port, reheat the soup and add the cream.

Serve immediately



Note: To make lemon flavoured croutons , melt some butter in a frying pan and fry cubes of white or brown bread until golden brown. Add a dash of lemon juice to pan and a sprinkling of salt. Stir to combine and serve in a soup bowl with the soup.
