#### Dualling of the A47 between North Tuddenham and Easton

Examination of the above application by the Planning Inspectorate involving the applicant and interested parties closed on 12 February 2022. There will now be a period of three months for the Examining Authority to write its report and make a recommendation to the Secretary of State. The Secretary of State will then have **three** months in which to make a decision.

# RECIPE FOR MARCH

#### **English Saucer Cheesecakes**

#### **Ingredients**

125 g rich short crust pastry

3 egg yolks

125 g curd cheese

50 g caster sugar

25 g candied peel, chopped

50 g raisins

Pinch of salt

Small level teaspoon of grated nutmeg

Grated rind of half a lemon

#### Method

Pre-set oven at 180°C or Gas mark 4

Roll out pastry on a floured board and cut into 4circlesto line 4 saucers or Yorkshire pudding tins.

Combine curd cheese with sugar, salt, nutmeg and lemon rind.

Beat in egg yolks to give a stiff mixture.

Divide the peel and raisins between pastry cases and spread the curd mixture over.

Bake in pre-heated oven for about 25 minutes until golden.

Serve warm.

Best with a stuffed bacon joint.

Mothoring Sunday was also known as Refreshment Sunday because the fasting rules for Lent were relaxed that day. Originally, both Old and

New Testament lessons on mid-lent Sunday made a point of food.

In the 16th century, Mothering Sunday was less about mothers and more about church. Back then, people would make a journey to their 'mother' church once a year. This might have been their home church, their nearest cathedral or a major parish church in a bigger town. The service which took place at the 'mother' church symbolised the coming together of families. This would have represented a significant journey for many.

Another tradition was to allow those working in the fields on wealthy farms and estates in England to have the day off on the fourth Sunday of Lent to visit their families and possibly go to church too. The custom of live-in apprentices and domestic servants going home to visit their mothers on Mothering Sunday started, checking that their families were well and taking food or money if needed. This was a time of year when food stocks were low, and a high-calorie cake was useful nutrition. As they walked along the country lanes, the younger amongst them would pick wild flowers or violets to take to church or give to their mother as a small gift.

Simnel cake has a strong affiliation to Mothering Sunday as it is usually associated with spring and Easter. It resembles a Christmas fruit cake but should be slightly lighter in texture. The other difference is the two layers of marzipan: Simnel cake should have a layer of marzipan running through the middle like a Victoria sandwich cake and then another layer of marzipan on the top. Traditionally, you should also roll some marzipan into eleven eggs and place these on the top. The eggs are supposed to symbolise the disciples who followed Jesus - note that Judas is excluded.

The meaning of the word "simnel" is unclear: there is a 1226 reference to "bread made into a simnel", which is understood to mean the finest white bread, from the Latin simila, "fine flour" (from which 'semolina' also derives). Various sources
