Recipe for May



Thai Salmon Filo Parc

Serves two people

Ingredients

2 salmon fillets approx.50 g each; 4 sheets of filo pastry each approximately 30 x 18 cm; 1 teaspoon of grated fresh ginger; grated zest and juice of 1 lime; 1 clove of crushed garlic; 1 tablespoon of chopped fresh coriander; 1 small spring onion finely sliced; 25 g of butter; salt and freshly milled black pepper.

To garnish: sprigs of coriander and 1 lime cut into quarters. Pre heat the oven to 190 degrees C. You will also need a baking sheet.

Method

First of all, in a small bowl, mix together the ginger, lime zest, garlic, coriander and spring onion then stir in the lime juice. Now melt the butter in a small saucepan then lay one sheet of filo pastry out on a flat surface. Brush it all over with melted butter. Spread another sheet of filo on top and brush it slightly with melted butter as well.

Now position one of the salmon fillets in near to one end of the filo. Season it and sprinkle half the lime and herb mixture on top. Next fold short end of the pastry over the salmon then fold long side inwards. Fold the salmon over twice more and trim any surface pastry. (it's important not to end up with great wedges of pastry at each end.)

Wrap the other piece of salmon in exactly the same way and when you're ready to cook, brush the parcels all over with melted butter. Place them on a baking sheet and bake in the pre-heated oven for 20 to 25 minutes or until the pastry is brown and crisp.

Serve garnished with sprigs of coriander and wedges of lime to squeeze over.

Saint Julian of Norwich

Few autobiographical details are actually known: indeed historians are not sure of her actual name, it is thought to be taken from St. Julian's church in Norwich though was also a girl's christian name in the Middle Ages. Julian's writings indicate her birth to be c.1342 and death 1416. It has been speculated her education was from the Benedictine nuns of Carrow Abbey, though there is no evidence of her being a nun at Carrow.

In her writings, Julian discusses the maternal nature of God which suggests she may have known of motherhood from bringing up her own children. As plague epidemics were rampant during the 14th century, she may well have lost some or most of her family and as a result been a young widowed mother.

Norwich was second in importance to London during 13th & 14th centuries, and within the primary region for trade & agriculture. In her lifetime the Black Death may have killed half of the population there. Julian was alive during the Peasants' Revolt of 1381, when several of the Lollards, who advocated reform of the church, were burnt at the stake at Lollards Pit just outside the city.

Julian became an anchoress, living in her cell attached to St. Julian's church from at least the 1390's, devoting her life to prayer to compliment the work of the clergy. Her solitary life would have begun after an onerous selection process, and an important ceremony would have taken place at her church in the presence of the bishop. Psalms would have been sung and at some point she would have been led to her cell. The door would afterwards have been sealed, and she would remain there for the rest of her life.

Once in her cell, as an anchoress she would have a strict set of rules to live by: confined isolation, poverty, chastity. The popular image of Julian with her cat for company stems from the regulations set out in the *Ancrene Riwle*. However she would not have been entirely secluded: a maid would have fetched her food and attended to her personal needs, and financial support would have been via prosperous members of the local community.

Julian recounts that she was thirty and a half years old when she received her visions. At the time ill and believing herself dying, she wrote her now famous work 'The Revelation of Divine Love'.
