Highways –A47 & NWL

The High Court in London has heard the appeal regarding plans to upgrade the A47 including the North Tuddenham to Easton section. Campaigner Andrew Boswell claims the government has not considered the full "cumulative" environmental impact of the three separate schemes. He said that, if successful, his case could affect road building policy across the country.

Recipe for June

Strawberry and White Chocolate Eton Mess

Ingredients

3 egg whites; 175g caster sugar; 1 tsp cornflour; 1 tsp white wine vinegar 500g frozen strawberries; 2 tbsp caster sugar; 2 tbsp elderflower cordial (a) 100g white chocolate, chopped; 1 tbsp freeze-dried strawberries 300ml double cream; 2 tbsp elderflower cordial (b); ½ tbsp icing sugar

Method

Heat the oven to 150C and line your largest baking sheet with baking paper. Pour the egg whites into a large, clean bowl and use electric beaters to whisk to stiff, frothy peaks. Add the sugar, a spoonful at a time, whisking well between each addition. Continue this until the sugar is used up, then continue whisking until you have a thick, shiny meringue that holds stiff peaks. Add the cornflour, vinegar and a pinch of salt, and whisk again.

Spoon four 9cm rounds onto the baking sheet, leaving large gaps in between, then with the remaining meringue mixture use a teaspoon to spoon small blobs on to the baking tray.

Put the tray into the oven and immediately turn the temperature down to 140C/fan and cook for ~1 hour-, then turn off the oven and leave to cool in the oven for 30 minutes, before moving on to wire racks to cool completely. Make the compote by tipping the strawberries into a pan along with the sugar and cordial (a). Bubble away until the strawberries have mostly broken down to form a syrup – you want to keep some bits of strawberries in there. Turn off the heat, leave to cool, then chill.

Put the white chocolate in a heatproof bowl and melt in short blasts in the microwave, then pour on to a lined baking tray. Use a pallet knife to spread out to a thin, even layer, then sprinkle over the freeze-dried strawberry pieces. Chill until needed.

Whisk together the cream, elderflower cordial (b) and sugar until it holds soft peaks. Gently break up some of the meringues into large pieces and dot some of them onto a large serving platter. Spoon over some of the cream and some of the compote, then repeat, building up the layers. Continue until you've used all of the cream and meringues, using the small ones you made to top.

Break the white chocolate bark into shards and scatter over the top.

Serve with a large spoon for serving and more of the strawberry compote to serve.

Our wonderful Norfolk Dialect......

Take for example the last command of Norfolk hero Nelson, 'Do you anchor Hardy?' which contains Norfolk dialect in as much as the 'do' is idiom for 'now you must'. 'Do' has two other idiomatic meanings in Norfolk, 'otherwise' and 'if', as this story demonstrates:

A young Norfolk mother is taking her son to a cousin for a holiday in London and says to her 'Do yew make him do as yew do, do he 'on't do as he ort ta do. Do he do as he do do, do yew let me know. And do he play yew up, do yew give him a doin' to. I do our other tew!'.

Here's a few more to amuse -

'Oid loike a bear' – 'A pint of ale please'

'Oh dare, oi hit a dare' – 'Oh bother, my car has hit a deer'

'Moy hart aloive! Slow yew down an' holed you harhd' – 'Gosh! Please go slowly and take your time'

'Bor, thassa lud a squit' – 'What a load of rubbish'

'Afta a few bears I wuz on the huh. That'll larn me' – 'After drinking, everything looked tilted. That taught me a lesson'

I driv all way t'a Yarmouth, an on way back tha snew' –'I went to Great Yarmouth and on the way back it snowed'

'He larned me owta roide a hoss' – 'He taught me how to horse ride'

'Cor blarst me, oi watta be gittin on hum suhn!' – 'I need to get home'

'Do that rain, git yew unda a tree' – 'If it starts to rain, shelter under a tree'

'Ar ya al reet bor? How you gewin?' – 'How are you?'
