North Tuddenham Parish Council met just after Christmas, where a plethora of highways issues were discussed; as ever, resources are stretched over the winter months in terms of repairs and restorative work, but outstanding reporting to Norfolk County Council has been followed-up and is being currently reviewed by our Highways Engineer. Our SAM2 device is also beginning its cycle of placement along Mill Road; so far we have received some interesting data for Main Road, with the last download showing that vehicles, on average, travel at 49.1mph. Of course, data suggests some vehicles do travel far in excess of this and this information will be retained for future evidence moving forward in our quest to lower the speed limit on Main Road.

#### **HIGHWAYS NEWS**

High Court dates have been set for the legal challenge over whether multi-million-pound dualling schemes on the A47 in Norfolk should be allowed to go ahead.

Climate change activist Dr Andrew Boswell launched a legal challenge, claiming the decisions were unlawful. He argued the impact of carbon emissions which would result from the schemes had not been properly addressed, with the cumulative effect of all the schemes not considered. He also argues the licensing relating to the Norfolk super-colony of barbastelle bats near the North Tuddenham scheme was not done correctly. His application for what is known as a judicial review was accepted and it has now been announced the hearings will be held at the Royal Courts of Justice in London on Wednesday, May 10 and Thursday, May 11. Judges will consider the evidence to decide whether the decisions to approve the schemes were lawful or not.

# RECIPE FOR FEBRUARY



### Hokey Pokey Coffee Cake (New Zealand)

#### **Ingredients**

**Cake:** 2 loose-based 20cm sandwich tins 4cm deep; 225g softened butter; 225g caster sugar; 4 large eggs; 225 g self raising flour; 1 level tbsp instant coffee mixed with 1 tbsp hot water & 75g walnuts chopped.

**Walnut Praline**: 2 tbsp water; 50g caster sugar & 50g walnut pieces **Butter Icing**: 75g softened butter; 250g icing sugar sifted; & 1 1/2 level tbsp instant coffee dissolved in 1 1/2 level tbsp hot water.

#### Method

**Cake** Preheat fan oven to 160 C. Lightly grease both the tins and line bases. Measure cake ingredients into mixing bowl and mix well. Divide between two tins. Flatten surfaces. Bake for 30-35 mins. until cakes are well risen golden and beginning to shrink away from sides Allow cakes to cool in the tins and then loosen them from the sides. Turn out on to wire rack, peel off paper and allow to cool completely.

**Praline** While cakes are baking you can make the praline. Put water and caster sugar into a small pan and heat gently to dissolve the sugar. Continue to heat, slowly and carefully, until turns to a nut brown.

Off the heat stir in the walnuts, then pour on to a non-stick baking parchment and leave to cool completely.

Roughly break up the cold hard praline with your fingers . Save the best for the top and chop up the remainder to add to the icing in the middle of the cake.

Icing Put the butter, icing sugar and coffee into a bowl and mix well. Select the cake with the best top, then place the other top down on a serving plate. Spread with half the icing and add the chopped praline Place the second cake on top and spread with remaining icing. Decorate with reserved walnut pieces.

### Feast of the Presentation of Jesus at the Temple

As well as being known as the Feast of the Presentation of Jesus at the Temple, other traditional names include Candlemas, the Feast of the Purification of the Virgin, and the Meeting of the Lord.

In the Eastern and Western Church years the Presentation of the Lord falls on 2 February, forty days (inclusive) after Christmas. In the Church of England it may be celebrated on this day, or on the Sunday between 28 January and 3 February.

The event is described in Luke 2:22–40: according to the gospel, Mary and Joseph took the Infant Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem forty days after His birth to complete the ceremony of Mary's purification after childbirth, and to perform a ritual sacrifice - the redemption of the firstborn son. Luke explicitly says that Joseph and Mary take the option provided for poor people (those who could not afford a sacrifice of a lamb), instead sacrificing a pair of turtledoves, or two young pigeons.

Upon bringing Jesus into the temple, they encountered Simeon. The Gospel records that Simeon had been promised that "he should not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ". Simeon then uttered the prayer that would become known as the *Nunc Dimittis*, or Canticle of Simeon, which prophesied the redemption of the world by Jesus:

"Lord, now let your servant depart in peace, according to your word; for my eyes have seen your salvation which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for glory to your people Israel". (Luke 2:29–32).

Then Simeon blessed them and said to His mother Mary, "This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed—and a sword will pierce your own soul too."
