
St Marys Church

American Cheesecake

Ingredients

20 cm loose-based cake tin.

170 g digestive biscuits, 75 g of butter, 40 g Demerara sugar.

125 g of full-fat soft cheese, 25g of caster sugar, 150 ml of pouring double cream, 150 ml of Greek yoghurt, juice of 1.5 lemons.

175 g of fresh strawberries and about 4 tbsp redcurrant jelly.

Method

Put the biscuits into a plastic bag and crush finely with a rolling pin. Melt the butter in a medium sized pan. Remove the pan from the heat and stir in the biscuit crumbs and sugar.. Press over the base and sides of the tin, then the leave to set.


To make the cheesecake filling, measure the cheese and sugar into a large bowl (or food processor) and mix well to blend thoroughly. Add the cream and yoghurt and mix again. Gradually add the lemon juice, whisking all the time. Turn the mixture into the tin over the biscuit crust, level the surface, and chill in the fridge overnight to set.

Run a knife round the edge of the biscuit crust to loosen the cheesecake, then push up the base or remove the sides of the tin and slide the cheesecake on to a serving plate.

Arrange the strawberries on top of the cheesecake. Heat the redcurrant jelly in a small saucepan until it has melted, and then carefully brush over the fruit. Leave to set. Serve chilled.

The Christian holiday of Pentecost is celebrated on the 50th day (the seventh Sunday) from Easter Sunday. It commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks, as described in the Acts of the Apostles.

The holiday is also called "Whit Sunday" or "Whitsun", especially in the United Kingdom, where traditionally the next day, Whit Monday, was also a public holiday. The Monday after Pentecost is a legal holiday in many European countries.

Regional customs and traditions:

In Italy it was customary to scatter rose petals from the ceiling of the churches to recall the miracle of the fiery tongues; hence in Sicily and elsewhere in Italy, the feast is called Pasqua rosatum. The Italian name Pasqua rossa comes from the red colours of the vestments used on Whitsunday. In France it was customary to blow trumpets during Mass, to recall the sound of the mighty wind which accompanied the Descent of the Holy Spirit.

In the northwest of England, church and chapel parades called Whit Walks take place at Whitsun (sometimes on Whit Friday, the Friday after Whitsun). Typically, the parades contain brass bands and choirs; girls attending are dressed in white. Traditionally, Whit Fairs (sometimes called Whitsun Ales) took place. Other customs such as morris dancing and cheese rolling are also associated with Whitsun. "Whitsunday" has been the name of the day in the Church of England. (The Book of Common Prayer only once uses the word "Pentecost" for the festival). Though some think that name derives from white clothes worn by newly baptised in Eastertide, it may well be seen as derived from "wit", hence "wisdom", the reference being to Holy Wisdom (Sancta Sophia, Hagia Sophia), referred to in Proverbs and the Book of Wisdom, with which the Holy Spirit has often been identified.
