CALL FOR SITES PUBLIC MEETING

North Tuddenham Parish Council will be holding a public meeting on Tuesday 12th September at 6.30pm at the Village Hall, to discuss the update of the Breckland Local Plan and its Call for Sites initiative.

There have been three sites put forward for consideration from our Parish, and we would welcome your opinions around the potential development of these areas. Call for Sites is a way for landowners, developers, individuals, parish and town councils and other interested parties to suggest sites for development, or for protection as Local Green Space.

This is still only a consultative process, but it is important that residents' views and thoughts are captured early to ensure an accurate and full official comment by the Parish Council as a statutory consultee as the process unfolds. Your voice as a stakeholder is crucial.

Recipe for August Blackberry



Ingredients.

1kg of blackberries.175 grammes of caster sugar.900ml of water.2 x 50ml spoons/2 tablespoonfuls of lemon juice.

Method.

Put the blackberries, sugar and water in a pan and cook gently until the blackberries are soft. Add the lemon juice. Then work to a puree through a sieve or strainer. Pour into a freezing tray or shallow rigid container. Freeze until thick and slushy.

Then turn the mixture into a bowl and beat thoroughly. Pour the mixture into a rigid container seal. Label and freeze. Transfer to the refrigerator for 5 minutes to soften slightly before serving

Serves 8 to 10 people.

Advertise your business in the Mardle £70 for year or £40 for 6 months The first-ever character that Walt Disney introduced to Universal Pictures in 1927 was Oswald the Lucky Rabbit, where he starred in animated short films from 1927 to 1938. Oswald was initially one of the characters who underwent personality animation. This is where the characters were treated to form their traits through their expressed mannerisms, movements, and acting instead of just their design. This character was inspired to be formed into a brave and adventurous rabbit with the ability to make his audience laugh using his gags. He used situational humour and frustration comedy as a unique angle for his films.

Walt Disney gets all the credit for creating Mickey Mouse, but it was actually his best friend Ub Iwerks who first brought the iconic character to life in 1928. After being forced to relinquish Oswald the Lucky Rabbit's production, Walt Disney continued to develop 'Mortimer Mouse who lives in the Mouston'. But he was later to change the character's name, Mortimer becoming Mickey Mouse. The name "Mickey" was derived from the name "Michael Theodore Mouse," which became the alias of this character after debuting in 1928. Mickey Mouse is one of the world's most notable fictional character, with his famous red shorts, white gloves, and huge yellow shoes.

Goofy is a cartoon character created by The Walt Disney Company. He is a tall, anthropomorphic dog who typically wears a turtle neck and vest, with trousers, shoes, white gloves, and a tall hat originally designed as a rumpled fedora. Goofy is a close friend of Mickey Mouse and Donald Duck. He is normally characterized as hopelessly clumsy and dim-witted, yet this interpretation is not always definitive; occasionally, Goofy is shown as intuitive and clever, albeit in his own unique, eccentric way.

Donald Duck in his 1934 theatrical debut, The Wise Little Hen, was created by Walt Disney when he heard Clarence Nash doing a peculiar voice while reciting "Mary Had a Little Lamb". Nash described the voice as that of a baby goat. Walt, however, insisted that it was a duck! Donald goes off on different adventures wearing his recognizable sailor shirt, cap, and bow tie. Donald is described as a fiery anthropomorphic duck who always falls victim to bad luck, but we love him, anyway. And so does Daisy Duck!
