The Nativity Story, told simply

In Nazareth, about 2000 years ago, the Angel Gabriel visited Mary and told her she was going to have a baby. The baby would be named Jesus and he would be God's son.

Mary told Joseph, whom she was engaged to be married to. They prepared for the birth of the special baby.

Not long after Angel Gabriel's visit, Mary and Joseph went to Bethlehem to pay taxes, Mary rode on a donkey over the hills of Galilee. Mary and Joseph arrived in Bethlehem; however, there was no room at the inns. They were tired and needed somewhere to rest. Christmas Baked Ham with Spiced Orange Rings

Ingredients

10-14 lb ham

Cloves

Glaze 1 Honey orange and ginger -

3 tablespoons clear honey, 3 tablespoons fresh orange juice, half teaspoon ground ginger and 1 tablespoon grated orange rind

Or Glaze 2 Honey and mustard -

3 tablespoons clear honey, 3 tablespoonfuls dry English mustard

Spiced orange rings

6 firm medium sized oranges 400ml white vinegar, 350 g granulated or soft brown sugar, 2 teaspoons ground cloves, 3 cinnamon sticks, half level teaspoon whole cloves & 3 blades mace




Cook ham in a large roasting tin at 180 degrees c, allowing 25minutes per 450g Score fat with a knife into diamond shapes. Insert clove into each diamond and spread chosen glaze over surface of ham. Return to oven at 190 degrees for further 30 minutes.

Meanwhile, wipe oranges thoroughly. Do not peel., but cut into thin even slices approx. 5mm thick. Discard any broken slices and ends. Put in a saucepan and barely cover with water. Bring to the boil, cover and simmer gently for 30-45 minutes or until peel is really tender. Drain cooking liquor into a clean pan, add vinegar, sugar and spices and heat gently until sugar has dissolved. Bring to the boil and boil hard for 10 minutes. Place the well drained oranges, a few a time, in the syrup and simmer gently until the rind becomes clear.

Decorate the ham with fresh orange slices in a row down centre of ham or with fried apple rings. Serve hot or cold with the spiced orange rings .





EDITH CAVELL

On the morning of October 12, 1915, the 49-year-old British nurse Edith

Cavell was executed by a German firing squad in Brussels, Belgium. This is the
final part of her story:- Edith had been hurriedly buried at the rifle range where she
was shot and a plain wooden cross put over her grave. The shaft of this cross can be
seen preserved at the back of Swardeston Church. When the war was over,
arrangements were made for Edith's reburial. At first, Westminster Abbey was
considered but the family preferred Norfolk. Her remains were escorted with great
ceremony to Dover and from there to Westminster Abbey for the first part of the
burial service on May 15th 1919, attended by Queen Alexandra, Princess Victoria and
many others from all walks of life with military and nursing representatives from many
parts of the world. Then by popular demand, her body was brought back to her native
Norfolk and lies in the Cathedral Close. A special train took the remains to Norwich
Thorpe Station and from there, a great procession to the Cathedral.

Bishop Pollock described her as 'alive in God', and as someone who taught us that our patriotism must be examined in the light of something higher. She was laid to rest outside the Cathedral in a spot called Life's Green. Here services are held annually on the Saturday nearest the anniversary of her death.

The grave is well tended and nearly always covered in flowers. Among Edith's most treasured possessions were the roses sent by her nurses, which she kept in her cell long after they were spent, as a comfort and a reminder of the roses at the Vicarage in Swardeston.
